“Eva’s Story - A Survivor’s Tale by Anne Frank’s step sister”

Eva Schloss was born in Vienna in 1929, and immigrated to Belgium and eventually to Holland with her family in 1938, shortly after Hitler annexed Austria. After the Germans invaded Holland in 1940, Eva and her family went into hiding. In May 1944, they were betrayed, captured, and sent to Auschwitz. Only Eva and her mother survived.

Since 1985, Eva Schloss has been active in Holocaust education. She has received an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Northumbria in Newcastle, England, and is a trustee of the Ann Frank Educational Trust of the UK. *Eva’s Story* was published in 1988, providing the opportunity to share her experiences. In 1995, she worked with the playwright James Still in the creation of the play *And Then They Came for Me: Remembering the World of Anne Frank*.
