Graduate Assistantship in Musicology

Stipend: Stipends are awarded for half-time or full-time nine-month contracts. In addition, students receive a tuition waiver. Administrative responsibilities may be added to achieve a full-time assistantship.

Duties: Teach appreciation music course for non-music majors.

Qualifications: Bachelor's degree in music and admission to graduate studies in the Hugh A. Glauser School of Music.

Audition: Graduate assistantship candidates in musicology must arrange for an on-campus interview or submit a videotape (15-20 minutes) of teaching skills to receive full consideration.

Degrees Offered: M.A. in theory, composition, ethnomusicology, and musicology; M.M. in performance, conducting, and music education; Ph.D. in theory-composition, music education, and musicology-ethnomusicology.

General Information: The Hugh A. Glauser School of Music is one of the most distinguished schools of music in the Midwest and is one of only three state-assisted schools of music in Ohio to offer degrees from the baccalaureate through the doctorate. The Glauser School houses the Center for the Study of World Musics, one of the nation's leading centers for the study of ethnic music, and the Kent/Blossom Music Program, among the most respected summer professional training festivals in the country.
